

Last-Minute Exam Reminders

- Bring a ruler with a straight edge.
- Read each entire free-response question before starting to answer it.
- **Answer the question being asked.** Read carefully. Many students lose points by answering a question they thought was being asked rather than the one that actually was.
- Make sure your graphs make sense. Most graphs are at most a couple of straight lines and a curve, or a sinusoidal wave.
- **Write legibly.** If the grader cannot read your writing, you will not receive credit.
- **Show all your work.** The grader will not guess what you did. If you run out of space inside the answer box, ask your proctor for an extra blank page. Make it clear on both the original page and the extra page which question and part the answer refers to.
- **Include units everywhere.** Add units to every number answer, every graph axis label, and every data table column label.
- **Do not leave anything blank.** Answer every multiple-choice question. For any free-response part you are running out of time on, write down the one equation you think is most relevant and attempt at least one step. Choosing the correct equation may earn a point even without a complete solution.
